After the RSNO's season-opening Viennese Gala concert, the classical season serves up a fresh batch of Lunchtime Concerts including Lark Piano Trio, Su-a Lee with Hamish Napier, and Nikita Lukinov, and there are exclusive Classical Stars performances from Paul Lewis, Steven Osborne with Alina Ibragimova, Bertrand Chamayou, and Jeneba Kanneh-Mason.

Our Children's Theatre Company in Residence, Dirliebane present BSL and English production BOUNCE for children aged five to nine, and the spotlight turns on our talented young people in Perth Youth Theatre's musical Into The Woods.


