The Role

Job Title: Senior Technician - Sound

Hours: On average 39 hours per week (2,028 annualised).

Department: Technical Services

Reports to: Head of Technical Services

Salary: £31,434 per annum

Purpose of Role

This role will form a part of our Technical Services division. You will be responsible for delivering a high standard of production and technical support to a wide range of performances across various genres of activity.

As Senior Technician – Sound, you will work closely with other Technical Teams, Production Teams, Venues Team, C&E Team & L&E Team. You will supervise Technicians, Casual workers & Freelancers as required, for specific projects or processes. You will also work with external partners such as Designers, Touring Managers, and Technicians.

You will be based at both Perth Concert Hall and Perth Theatre and will be required to work across both spaces. You may be asked to tour with productions and undertake other projects off site on occasion, which may include overseas tours.

Duties and Responsibilities

Supervision

- Manage the team on the projects you are overseeing, ensuring they are scheduled appropriately and informed of the work to be undertaken;
- Take on day-to-day supervision of a varying proportion of the technical pool ensuring they are supported and respond to absences;
- Support and develop the wider team to expand their skills and expertise in sound and provide training to all members of the Technical Services team on Sound specialisms;
- Support the whole technical pool with challenges and difficulties in your area of expertise. This may include out of hours support;
- Support the Head of Technical Services in ensuring the technical pool are clear on their tasks, duties and responsibilities;
- Ensure that team members time is fully utilised and productive time is maximised.

Specialist

- Responsible for ensuring you are familiar with current, safe and effective techniques for the delivery of sound craft in both a Theatre and Live Events environment;
- Ensure that all sound equipment is thoroughly maintained, compliant and ready for use as required;
- Ensure the practical delivery of productions working both with production managers, designers, other departments and colleagues within the technical team to ensure delivery of safe and effective sound solutions;
- Use your skills to fit up, de rig, program and operate as well as act as Duty Stage Manager and venue representative as required;
- Share your skills with our community as a core of our Learning and Engagement program;

- Attend production meetings, undertake advance preparations, testing, and facilitation for productions and support the progression of performances from start to finish as required;
- Ensure sound activity meets safety standards and ensure the maintenance of the areas under your control;
- Support visiting companies and individuals throughout their time back of house, ensuring safe systems are communicated;
- Ensure that all areas back of house are maintained clean, tidy and presentable;
- Support the Head of Technical in planning logistics, fit ups, get outs and rotas;
- Train technicians and crew, and any other staff who undertake sound roles and ensure clear procedures are in place;
- Have a full knowledge of back of house evacuation procedures and be a part of emergency response arrangements;
- Ensuring that in-coming equipment complies with Perth Theatre and Concert Hall's Health and Safety standards.

Technical Team

Alongside your colleagues in the technical team, you will support all aspects of the department's workload using your skills across all disciplines to deliver the company program of work, including stage duties, fly duties, fit ups, get outs, format changes, technical cover and building duty shifts. You may be invited to design on shows.

Health and Safety

- Ensure you keep up to date with current H&S regulations relevant to the industry and any changes;
- Ensure a safe working environment and that all safe practices are adhered to including house policies, SSOW and compliance with statutory obligations, keeping suitable records maintained;
- Risk assess your areas of work and ensure that all hazards are suitably and effectively controlled;
- Ensure that all equipment under your control is compliant and work with the Head of Technical Services to ensure routine inspections take place and repairs are made in a timely fashion;
- Support the Head of Technical Services in the promotion of and delivery of a safe working environment as well as a positive health and safety culture.

Responsibilities of all staff

- Contribute to an enthusiastic, positive work climate within the organisation;
- Be aware of the work of other departments in the achievement of the company's charitable objectives;
- Take an active part in communicating and co-operating with other staff and departments;
- Follow all PTCH guidelines, policies and procedures;
- Work in accordance with PTCH Equality & Diversity Policy;
- Be aware of and comply with rules and legislation pertaining to Health & Safety at Work;
- Take an active part in achieving high standards of customer and client care;
- Support green and sustainable initiatives;
- Be GDPR compliant;
- Undertake other duties as may be reasonably required by the organisation

Person Specification

You will be a highly motivated, experienced with a passion for the delivery of performances and events. You will have experience of in a live environment and be practiced at working with a range of creative individuals to assess and deliver on their needs.

You will work closely with across the team to ensure that suitable consideration and planning is made for the delivery of stage aspects on all projects and will openly share your knowledge and understanding of practical delivery to ensure a smooth production process.

Your background may be in theatre or live events or a mixture of both, and you will bring with you a desire to deliver exemplary production standards across various genres, styles and disciplines of work.

You will have the responsibility of being a key holder.

Most of all you will bring your enthusiasm for the performing arts.

We are looking for a strong track record and skills in the following areas:

- A suitable technical/production qualification, or at least 5 years' experience in a similar role, with specific knowledge of current stage & practice;
- A clear understanding of the role and function of a sound department within both producing theatre and receiving house environment;
- Experience with Networking and in venue sound distributions systems including Dante;
- Yamaha QL/CL series Operation and programming;
- CueLab Programming;
- Understanding of OSC & Symmetrics set up;
- Experience of Live theatre, Live Music, Corporate and Live stream audio mixing;
- Experience managing casual staff;
- Experience undertaking risk assessments;
- Able to undertake physical tasks (including working at height);
- Good communication skills;
- Good demonstrable working knowledge of Microsoft & Mac operating systems;
- First aid training (or willingness to be trained);
- Ability to carry out manual tasks and work at height.

Desirable

- Experienced of having advanced shows with both in house and incoming production teams;
- IPAF certificate;
- Experience with Q-SYS;
- Design experience;
- Inservice inspection and testing qualification;
- IOSH Managing Safely qualification;
- Driving licence;
- Experience of working with children;
- Knowledge of sound, rigging, flying, and AV control.
